Change in Hampton Village

The ancient philosopher, Heraclitus said: "The only thing that is constant is change." In other words, the only thing we can count on is things will change. Some change we like and some we will not. In this edition you will read about some changes coming to Hampton Village.

A long awaited change is the opening of schools in Hampton Village this fall. Associated with this change are traffic calming measures to ensure the safety of all children as they walk or ride their bikes from all parts of our neighbourhood to school. All traffic calming initiatives surrounding the school will be in place by the time the school opens.

Having our own school means the location of the HVCA board meetings will change to the Community Room effective November 2017. In the New Year, more of our indoor programming will occur in the new school. Having schools in our community will centralize the location of our programming. It will also impact the number and variety of programs we can offer. For instance we will have some daytime programming as of this fall! Daytime programming includes English Language practice, Cribbage and Coffee, and Mom and Baby Fitness. See dates and times on page 3. Volunteers are needed for the English Language practice program. Training and support is provided for those who are interested. See page 9 for details.

Another positive change is the progress of the strip mall on McClocklin Road. The road construction that will be associated with the change will be a change we will not like while we are in the midst of it. You can read more about that in Troy Davies' report to the community on page 4.

There has even been a change to our local pizzeria. Around the end of May the Homer's Pizza store ceased to be a franchise and became an independent pizza store. This change means a new name and phone number but same great pizza and even better prices!

And even the soccer age groups have changed! SYS will now include children in the U5, U6 and U9 categories. Kinder soccer will be for children who are 3 years of age as of October 1, 2017.

Changes will be required to the HVCA board as current board member positions expire and some current members are unable to continue in their current roles. Perhaps you would like to join the board as together we navigate the changes which will impact our community! Attend the AGM on Wednesday October 11th and see how you can influence change!

Update for Ward 4

Hi All;

There is plenty happening throughout Ward 4 and in Saskatoon that will be shared in my yearly update but for now I wanted to focus on some major developments that will be taking place in Hampton Village over the next few months.

Off Leash Dog Park

Trees along the roadway, and fence have been installed. Gates and information kiosks are planned to be installed in August.

Parking Lot surface to be completed in August.

Seeding grass occurred on August 4th.

Total completion date will be fall of 2017.

Hampton Village Business Park

Concept Plan passed at City Council July 26th This will be a Commercial Development to serve Hampton Village, Westview, Dundonald, and the Airport Business Area.

McClocklin Road will be closed from East Hampton Blvd. to Claypool Drive from August 14 – the end of October to build the new road that will include sidewalks, lighting, and proper width for a major Arterial Road. Once this road is complete the first node of Commercial Development will begin on the West corner of McClocklin and Claypool. You may have already seen the Tim Horton's "*Coming Soon*" sign. More franchises are coming but are still in the works so I'm not able to release the names at this time.

You are going to see a lot of developments happening in this Business Park over the next 2-4 years.

Land beside the Shoppers Drug Mart

We are currently finalizing a deal for this land. The hope is to have commercial development start late fall or early spring of 2018.



Off Leash Dog Park Ambassador Program

The new Hampton Village Off Leash Dog Park is scheduled to open this fall. It will be known as the Paul Mostoway Off Leash Dog Park. Who was Paul Mostoway? He was a noted Saskatoon citizen, who served on city council for two terms from 1988 - 1994. Mr. Mostoway was also a trustee with the Catholic School Board from 1985-1994. He was the first ever to concurrently hold seats as a Councillor and a Trustee. While there will be no official grand opening of the park, the city will notify Hampton Village residents of the opening on the city website and through a public service announcement. In the meantime, the city is looking for a **Dog Park ambassador**.

The roles of a Dog Park Ambassador include:

- 1. Relaying issues or concerns regarding the dog park to the city.
- 2. Attending or sending a designate to the two annual dog park meetings.
- 3. Ensuring Hampton Villagers are aware of off leash dog park rules of use.
- 4. Encouraging dog park users to take ownership of the dog park above the minimum provided by the City.
- 5. Seeking new ways to improve and promote the use of off leash dog parks.



HVCA Garage Sale and Pancake Breakfast – May 13, 2017





One of the play's cast members, Rana Mustafa, is a Syrian woman who moved to Canada last year. Rana helped incorporate Syrian songs into this year's musical presentation. People of all ages seemed to enjoy the music and dancing opportunities during the play.
