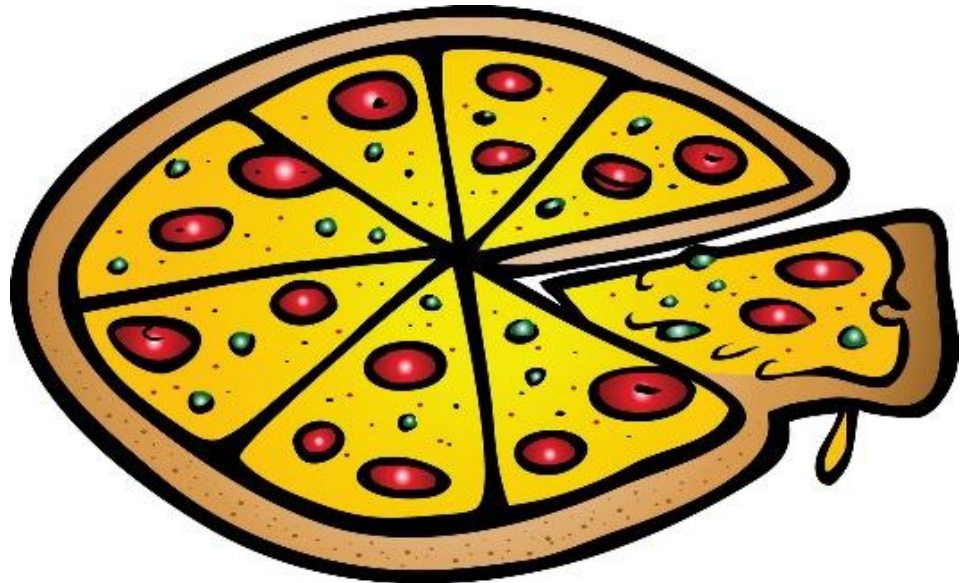

NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO HVCA BYLAWS

At the October 12th meeting, the board will present two amendment to our bylaws.

Amendment 1

- To amend Bylaw 7.04 to remove the position of Webmaster as a board position.

Amendment 2

- To amend Bylaw 7.04 to add the position of Allocation Coordinator as a board position.

Rationale

- Brent to continue as webmaster, posting information to the HVCA website as directed by the president, secretary and communications director. At the June meeting, all board members, including Brent, agreed the webmaster position need not be a board member.
- The Allocations position will coordinate the booking of school space and sports fields for programming, soccer and kinder soccer.

Amendments to the bylaws must be passed by at least 2/3 majority of community members present at the AGM. The voting may take place by secret ballot when requested.

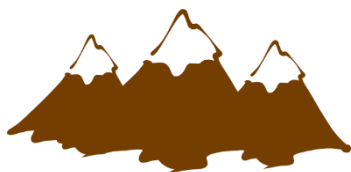

Update from the Gardens of Hampton Village

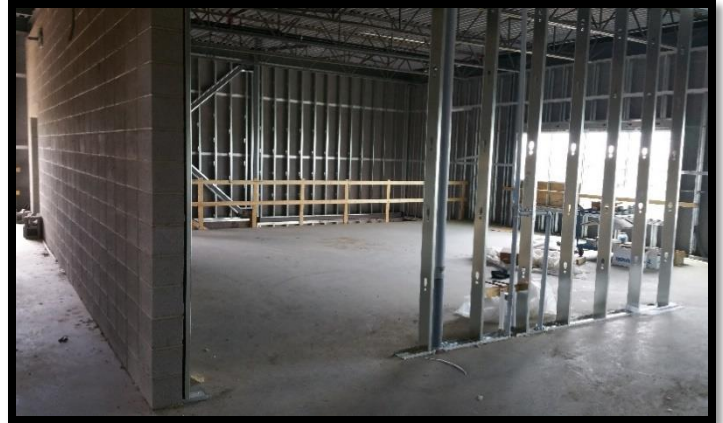

Construction Season in Hampton Village



I turned left from Claypool Drive onto McClocklin Road on Saturday, July 30. There were no barriers, but was the road “officially reopened”? It was due to reopen on August 2. What a pleasure to drive on this recently forbidden section of smooth, dark, black asphalt! The reopening of the road marks the end of road improvements at that corner. It will also restore traffic patterns and noise to the east side of McClocklin Road. The inclusion of a traffic light at the intersection of McClocklin and Claypool is a welcome, forward thinking addition. It will aid traffic flow now and into the future when the business park is developed. At the traffic meeting on June 14th, city engineers mentioned McClocklin Road was built as a temporary access road which is why it has no shoulders. When the business park development begins, the curve of McClocklin Road may change as sidewalks, access driveways and other streets cross McClocklin to make way for the businesses and industry planned for this area.

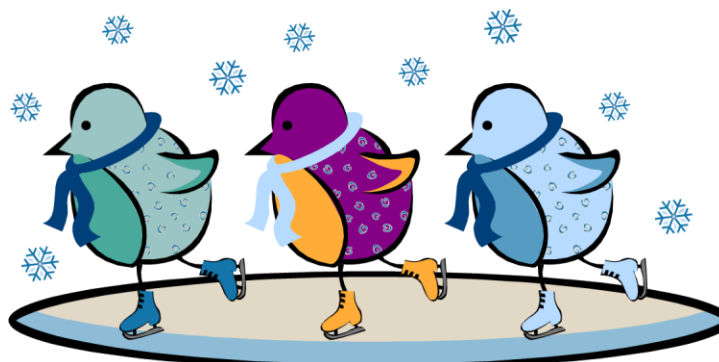

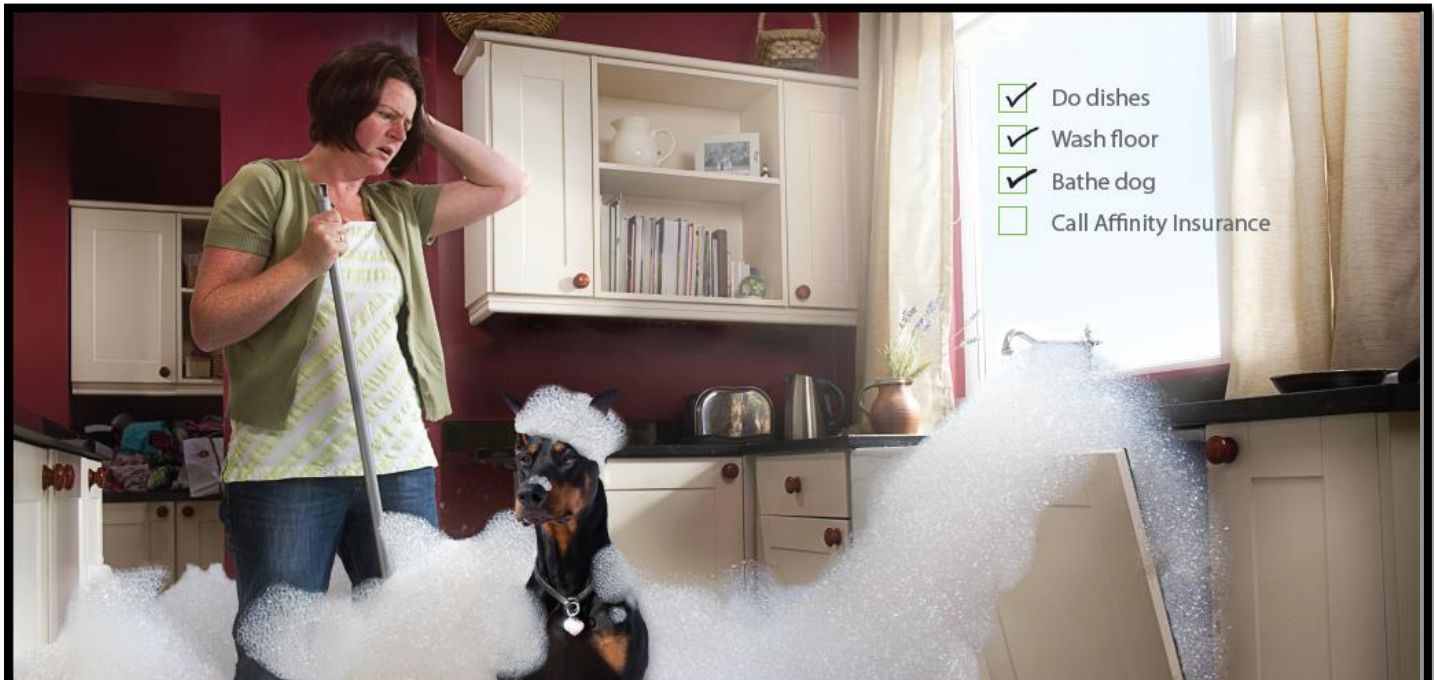

Theatre in the Park—July 15, 2016



"Little Badger and the Fire Spirit" was a delightfully creative, musical adaptation of Elder Maria Campbell's children's book which tells the legend of how fire came to the aboriginal people. It is a story about an unlikely hero, one who conquers with kindness. Who is this unlikely hero? Little Badger. What makes him such an unlikely hero? He is blind. A hot, sunny night set the stage for the second year SumTheatre presented a live theatre event in Hampton Village which was attended by 291 people, 5 dogs and 2 rabbits! In spite of the hot weather, the central character, Little Badger, convinced us it was cold, very cold and his people were suffering. Their suffering drove

Little Badger to ask his friend Grey Coyote for help. He tells Little Badger of the mountain where fire can be found. Grey Coyote also warns Little Badger that going in search of fire is a dangerous journey and that he should "Follow the trail, smell the sweetgrass. Always be kind." Little Badger is undaunted and departs on the journey to bring fire and warmth to his people. His physical blindness puts him in a unique position as he encounters each danger. He must touch each beast/ danger to know them and in so doing he befriends them. As a friend, he is able to proceed on his mission and overcome each danger. In the end, the Fire Spirit gives Little Badger fire which he brings back to save his people. Perhaps we should all follow Little Badger's example and always be kind.

Traffic Review Meetings—June 14, 2016 & in early 2017

City traffic engineers arranged the Hampton Village Neighbourhood Traffic Review meeting on June 14th at Hampton Free Methodist Church which was attended by about 30 Hampton Villagers. This meeting was the first phase of the 2016 Traffic Review Process for Hampton Village.

Phase 1 identified traffic issues and some possible solutions through community consultation.

During the meeting areas of traffic concerns were raised and possible solutions were offered by residents in attendance. It was reassuring to hear that traffic calming strategies are implemented automatically around new schools. In addition to a discussion about traffic concerns, city engineers presented information regarding the Business Park that will be presented to Council for approval hopefully in November / December 2016. There was also a brief discussion about the pending rezoning of the vacant lot between Hampton Free Methodist Church and Shoppers Drug Mart. Information from phase 1 will be used for each phase of the traffic review process.

Phase 2 In the coming months a draft traffic plan will be developed.

Phase 3 In early 2017, the draft traffic plan will be presented to the community for further feedback Watch for an announcement about the next meeting!

Phase 4 Beginning in spring 2017, traffic changes will be implemented over time.
