Hampton Village Rink Update

A big ***Thank You*** to everyone on the Board, their family, friends and the many community residents who have pitched in with the rink relocation project. Without your help this project would not have happened this year. Your help and enthusiasm is appreciated. The new rink will be a valuable recreation asset in our neighbourhood for decades to come, and will, once again, be a gathering place for our community!

What has been done...

- The plan for the new rink was developed after research by Ron L., the former Rink Coordinator. Michelle, a community resident, prepared professional drawings for Ron's plan.
- City staff surveyed the rink site to mark elevations for levelling and then again to mark the corners of the rink. They also did the initial levelling of the rink site.
- Ashley, a Hampton Village resident helping with the rink relocation project, coordinated the build of the rink – he arranged for Nordic to install the posts/mesh and another professional crew to install the wood boards based on the original redevelopment plans. The rink is the same size as the old one but the 2" x 4" treated wood makes the rink look really great!
- TM Construction helped in many ways including: adding soil and levelling the inside of the rink, preparing the pad for the rink shack and skirting the bottom exterior of the rink to maintain the earth pack inside the rink.
- Community Association volunteers and community residents held a work bee to re-install the Puck Board. Thank you Cathy, Ron, Kelly, Glen, Jarett, Jackson, Jan, Pat, and Trent!
- Brunner's trenched in the water service.
- Another contractor moved the rink shack back to the rink site.
- Peter, another community resident, is helping install the lighting for the community rink. Peter is working with Cathy and Aim Electric on the lighting plan and logistics. The trenching for the lighting is complete and two light posts have already been installed!

What is yet to be completed...

The locating of the portables at the school and the extreme cold weather has slowed the remaining projects. The biggest outstanding project is for SaskPower to connect the power to the rink shack. This power heats the water line, keeping the water from freezing so flooding of the rink can occur. At point of writing, we do not have a confirmed date for this to occur. We will explore other rink flooding options if there is a further delay with the power connection. We will be planning a big rink grand opening towards the end of January. 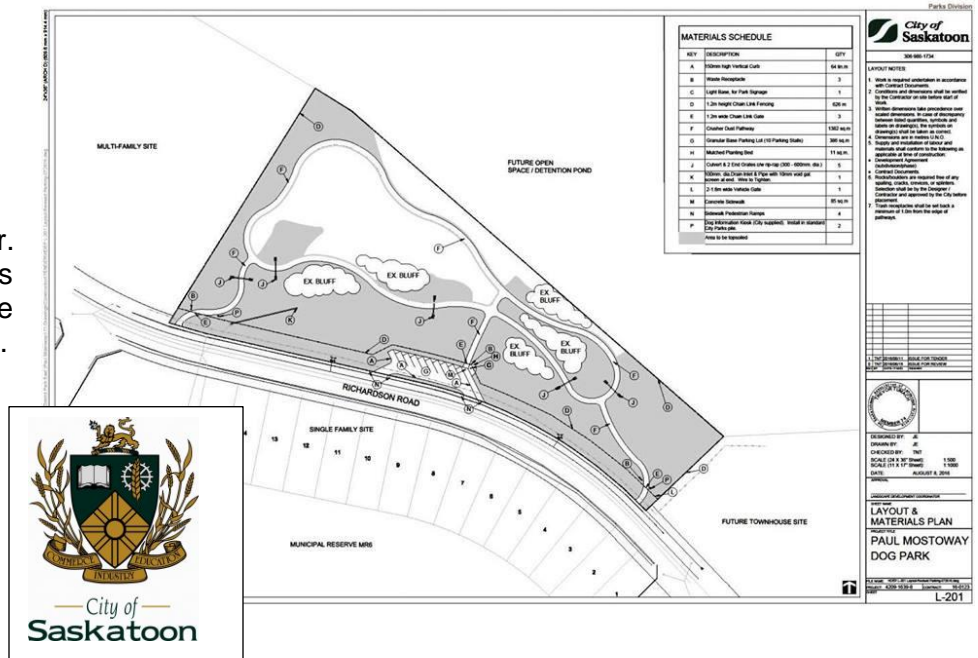

Hello Hampton Village residents. I wanted to share some information in regards to Hampton Village Development. Over these next two years we are going to be seeing a lot of things happening in this neighbourhood.

Off Leash Dog Park

The off leash Dog Park tender was awarded on Sept 21st. The city is waiting on the bonding and insurance letters from the contractor. The delay for the tender release was due to proper drainage infrastructure for rain storm events being installed. This was signed off in Sept. The location (picture attached) is 1435 Richardson Rd. and the contractor was able to start clearing shrubbery and surface material this fall. This project will be completed in 2017.



The Fire Hall Designated Land beside Shoppers – New Zoning as of November 28th

At the Council hearing on November 28th the vacant lot between the Church and Shopper's Drug Mart was rezoned to B2 zoning. This gives us the green light to look for investors to build what I personally want to see...Restaurant / lounge, coffee shops etc... The Fire Hall will be moving to a future location of Claypool Drive and Latrace Rd once it's completed to Claypool.

McClocklin Rd. (between East Hampton and Claypool Drive)

This is the first item to be addressed in the Concept Plan for the Hampton Business Park. McClocklin Road was never designed to be a main road and must be replaced with a proper road, lighting, and sidewalks. I'm working with DREAM to try to make this happen next spring. I will keep you posted.

We are also happy to announce that our local Sparks group will be helping to plant and care for our community plot next year, instilling garden skills in the next generation while learning about their local community.

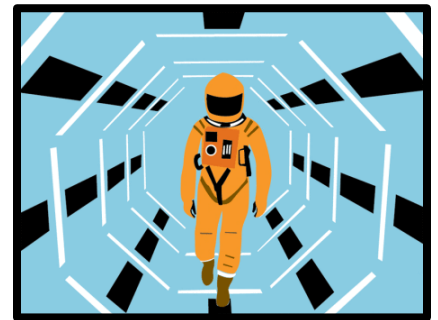

The Ripple Effect of Building a school and a rink

The rink and school construction has meant much heavy equipment has tracked over Al Anderson Park. As a result, the turf and irrigation system have been damaged. In 2017, the city will assess and remediate the damage to the turf and the irrigation system in Al Anderson Park. The city will also expand the soccer field in Al Anderson Park to the original dimensions after the outdoor soccer season. In addition, the city will relevel the interior of the rink and assess whether or not an earth berm is required on the exterior of the rink. After this, the Community Association will be responsible for any future levelling of the rink surface that may be required. Finally, drainage issues where City land and School land meet will be fixed. Until that is complete, there may be some flooding on the soccer pitch in Al Anderson East.
