Garage Sale Tips - Before Sale Day & Set Up

- Be prepared for the garage sale BEFORE 8:00 a.m shoppers tend to show up early
- Have plenty of change on hand (both coin and paper)
- Have enough tables to display your items
- Large colourful items should be placed at the front of your property
- Have an outlet available if customers want to try any appliance
- Clothing is best sold if hung neatly on a rack (a broom stick between two ladders works) and clearly priced

Garage Sale Tips - Sale Day

- Use balloons at the front of your lot to draw customers to your sale
- Park your vehicles off street if possible for visibility and parking
- Count your float prior to the sale so you can keep track of your earnings!
- Have help at least two people available to run you sale allows you to have bathroom breaks and better customer service

Garage Sale Tips – Pricing

- Have all pricing completed a week in advance, and set up tables the day before, ready to move them out to their visible location
- If you have odds-and-ends items, such as mismatched glasses, price them at 6 for \$1.00 instead of \$0.15
- Be prepared to barter with your customer, and as the day goes on you may want to reduce prices on some items to clear them out
- If doing a multi-group sale, put a last name initial on the tags, remove tags as you sell the items and ten go through all tags at he end of the day to determine who gets what profit

City of Saskatoon Leisure Access Program

This program is offered through the City of Saskatoon Community Services Department and is designed to address the needs of low-income residents within the city. Saskatoon residents who fall below the low-income cut-offs as outlined on the application form are eligible to receive a one-year Leisure Card which will provide unlimited access to all drop-in activities (ie drop-in fitness and aquafitness, public swimming, open gym and weight rooms, public skating (Cosmo Arena Only) at any of the indoor leisure centres, outdoor pools, and the Terry Fox Tract. Residents who qualify for the program may also sign up for one registered program free of charge per calendar year.

Saskatoon

The City of Saskatoon is developing the first ever

Culture Plan for Saskatoon. A Culture Plan had been identified as an important legacy of the 2006 Cultural Capitals designation. The Culture Plan is intended to identify municipal and community priorities for strengthening the arts and cultural sector and elevating its role in sustainable city building.

The Plan is being developed collaboratively by City of Saskatoon staff, under the direction of the Community Development Branch, community arts and cultural stakeholders and Saskatoon residents. The City has hired the Office for Urbanism, based out of Toronto, to facilitate the process.

The process began in November of 2009 with a series of interviews with key arts, culture, heritage, business and tourism stakeholders. On March 4 and 5, an event was held for over 100 arts and cultural stakeholders at TCU Place. The event was designed to introduce the project to stakeholders and to provide an opportunity to collaborate. Stakeholders took the reins by generating big ideas about the vision, principles, and key policy directions for the Culture Plan.

From here, the Project Team will work on organizing the ideas into a draft framework for the Culture Plan. A major public consultation event is scheduled to be held in the Fall of 2010, at which time the outcomes of the detailed planning work along with a draft Culture Plan will be presented for feedback from residents of Saskatoon at a public open-house. Saskatoon's community associations will be invited to this event as your input is important. In the meantime, we invite you to visit the project website to read about the process and what has been discussed to date.


