Did you know Hampton Village has a sign?

It is located at the northwest corner of the Shopper's Drug Mart parking lot. As the sign coordinator, I post Hampton Village community happenings at the direction of the Hampton Village Association Board on our mobile sign. I have five lines and 14 spaces to relay news to the community so at times I have to be creative to get the message to you!

Our sign recently underwent an upgrade. The back side of the sign now sports gleaming white boards with Hampton green letters directing Hampton Villagers to check out our website for community information. This upgrade not only increases our community visibility, it makes our sign more attractive and more stable in the event of strong winds.

The annual cost to fund our sign is approximately \$400.00. This includes our annual sign permit fee of \$30.00, monthly space rental fee of \$25.00 and sandbags (which are replaced on an as needs basis) to help anchor the sign.



Coming up with the message that fits the Hampton Village Sign is a monthly challenge!

My next post on the sign will be to advertise the Hampton village Community Association Annual General Meeting or in sign board terms: HVCA AGM! It is happening on Wednesday, October 8 at 6:30 and we will be serving piping hot pizza. We are always in need of volunteers to help great things happen in Hampton Village. - Be on the lookout for strangers or suspicious activity! Note licence plate numbers of suspicious vehicles and descriptions of suspicious people. Criminals are often caught after alert neighbors contact police.
- Share Information with neighbors & on our Hampton Village Neighborhood Face Book Page!
- If you find a door or window that has been forced or broken while you were absent, do not enter: call police from a cell phone or from neighbors.
- If your home has been unlawfully entered, do not clean up or touch anything until the police have inspected for evidence.

## Community Watch

Community Watch is a flexible crime prevention and crime interruption program that supports the partnering of the Saskatoon Police Service and the community in making our communities a safe place to live and work.

### Make a difference!!

Being involved in the collection & reporting of crime related info will assist in making your community a safer place to live & work. With proper information, communities & police can work on solutions to existing problems.

### Why Report Suspicious Behavior?

The members of our community are the ones most familiar with the people, vehicles, activity & routines in our neighborhood. The community is best able to identify when something varies from the norm or isn't right. Police seldom come across crimes in progress, and you can't assume someone else has already called the police, or that they see the same things you do - **REPORT SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR!**

### It's easy to get involved!!

- Introduce yourself to your neighbours - A good neighbour is one of the most effective crime prevention tools!
- Investigate variations from the norm but from a safe distance. Call Police if something seems suspicious!
- Share information you receive through the Community Watch network, with Police, on our Hampton Village Facebook page, with neighbors or anyone else you feel may benefit from it.
- Place a Community Watch sticker on your door to show your commitment to crime prevention.
- Do a security audit of your home or business & upgrade any deficiencies.
- Mark and photograph your property for identification

  - To anonymously report info to the police call Crimestoppers at 975-TIPS
  - To report an ongoing problem in your neighbourhood call the Community Liaison Officer- Northwest - 975-2296

# Securing Your Property

It was the inline-skate tracks in her living room which got Nicole's attention. "He was in the house at ten-to-ten in the morning for fifteen minutes. He found one of our supermarket bags, filled it up with whatever electronics he could find, and then rollerbladed out."

This wasn't the first theft Nicole and her husband Trevor (who asked this newsletter not to reveal their family name) experienced since moving into their Hampton Village home four years ago, but it was the most brazen. "Thieves got into our vehicles maybe a year after we moved here. We noticed that someone had rummaged through them. This time, they broke in by dismantling the front door handle with a screwdriver."

Many residents in the community have also noticed property crimes such as this in recent years, but they are not alone. There has been a recent uptick in break-ins and thefts in other suburban areas in the city as well.

"The biggest targets are those vehicle owners who leave items in the cars, such as power cords for iPhones, loose change, anything of value," says Inspector Dale Solie, the Saskatoon Police Service officer in charge of the city's Northwest Division. "Another ongoing problem is those who leave their keys in the car. Usually, a thief is looking for something else when they come across the key. Then they take the car for a joyride."

To protect against these crimes, Insp. Solie advises people to take precautions. "Keep your car doors locked and don't leave valuables inside. You should also get to know your neighbours. Most importantly, report any theft or other incidents to the police immediately."

After the first vehicle break-in, Nicole and Trevor bought a simple security camera from Costco and installed it on their property. The camera recorded the inline-skater thief approaching and leaving their house, although they couldn't identify him. Trevor later bought a HD camera, which was able to clearly identify the faces of culprits of a more recent break-in and theft. Both videos are now posted on YouTube and Reddit. They also invested in a security system for their home.

Nicole and other Hampton Villagers have been sharing their experiences on the Hampton Village Neighbourhood Facebook page. Community members are talking about this issue and trying to come up with solutions.

"People should try to become more aware of what's going on around our homes," says Nicole. "They need to report these crimes so that the police will send more patrols to the neighbourhood."

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## Proposed Off Leash Dog Park for Hampton Village

Hampton Villagers know there is an off leash dog park next to the airport in Corman Park but road closures make it difficult to get there. Have no fear! A new Off-leash Dog park is being proposed within Hampton Village. The proposed location is along Richardson Road and East of McClockin Road. My little Chihuahua and I are looking forward to the prospect of an easily accessible off leash dog park in our neighbourhood.



Who will you see at the dog park? In addition to meeting other dog owners and their pets you may see bylaw enforcement officers and Dog Park Ambassadors. Bylaw enforcement officers occasionally patrol off leash dog parks to ensure animals are licensed as this is one off leash dog park requirement. Dog Park Ambassadors help park users to stay safe and have fun with their animals.

I attended the second public information meeting for the proposed off leash dog park for Hampton Village which was held on Thursday, September 4, from 3 - 7 p.m. The meeting was "come and go" format with City of Saskatoon staff in attendance to answer questions. I was able to view the revised off leash dog park plan. This plan incorporates suggestions from the initial meeting held in May and the subsequent online survey. The proposed plan is very pleasing to the eye.

I like that the revised plan proposes maximum use of the available space and has three access points. This means my dog's walk can be as long or short as I would like it to be. The plan is for the trail to be covered in crusher dust which should make it less muddy in spring. That is a definite bonus because no one likes wet feet! The addition of a wide buffer zone of green space with trees and benches on the street side of the park will increase "curb" appeal and invite all residents to enjoy the space. Parking was another concern raised by survey participants. To alleviate the parking concerns, ten parking spaces have been added to the front entrance way of the park. I have included a picture of the proposed plan. You can still provide comments regarding the revised plan by visiting <http://shapingsaskatoon.ca/>

A report will be prepared and presented to city council. If the report is approved by city council development of the off leash dog park could begin in spring/summer 2015! I can hardly wait! I look forward to meeting you there!

## Stay Alert, Stay Safe

I would like to urge all members of the community to increase their awareness and level of caution as children return for the 2014/2015 school year. Drivers are reminded to watch for children on foot and on bicycles as well as additional activity near bus stops and around school zones.

School crossing guards may be on duty at some schools during the upcoming school year and motorists should be extra cautious whenever children are present.

Parents and caregivers are encouraged to promote safety with their children and remind them to stay alert while on the school bus, and while walking or riding to and from school. The start of the school season is a great opportunity to go over street-proofing tips and safety strategies with children.

### Street Proofing Tips:

- Never approach a stranger.
- Stay away from vehicles you do not know.
- Be wary of strangers who are overly friendly or take an unusual interest in you.
- You can go places and accept things from people you know, but first get your parents permission and tell them where you are going, who you are with, and when you will return home.
- Avoid potentially dangerous places such as secluded areas in parks, school yards after school is finished, alleyways, lane ways, and empty parking lots.
- Never get into a stranger's vehicle.
- Never engage in conversation with a stranger who is walking or driving a vehicle. Always stay back a safe distance and continue walking while being aware of the stranger's actions.
- If you are ever confronted by a stranger, do whatever it takes to break free, such as loud screams, biting, kicking, and rolling on the ground.
- Never accept gifts, money, or candy from a stranger.
- Always walk to and from school with brothers, sisters, or friends.
- Whenever possible, if approached, try to remember the licence plate number, vehicle description, and the stranger's description.
- Contact the police as soon as possible for assistance by calling 911.
