COVID Policies for our Spring Programs

(April—June, 2022)

The Hampton Village Community Association wants to bring people together and keep people active—safely.

COVID spreads from an infected person to others through respiratory droplets and aerosols. No one "single" precaution will *stop* the spread of COVID when people get together for sports & recreation, but each step we take helps to *minimize* the spread. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we strive to achieve this goal.

- 1. Masks are STRONGLY encouraged at all times for everyone. On request, medical-grade masks can be provided.
- 2. Everyone must hand sanitize upon entering the facility.
- 3. Do not come to the program if you:
 - have COVID
 - have COVID symptoms
 - have had close contact with a COVID positive (or COVID suspected) person or
 - are currently being tested for COVID and are awaiting results.
- 4. Wherever practical, stay 6 feet away from others.
- After a program, if you develop COVID symptoms and/or are told that you were a close contact of a COVID positive person, you MUST let us know so that we can determine if there was a risk of transmission to other participants. Your confidentiality will be respected.
- Additional COVID precautions may be added to specific programs, based on risk.
- 7. Cards, Games & Coffee requires participants to wear masks at all times, unless eating or drinking.
- 8. Youth Soccer (U5, U7 & U9) This soccer program is a partnership between the Community Association and SYSI. In addition to our COVID protocols, all SYSI COVID protocols for participants and parents must be followed. The Soccer Coordinators will share this information with participants/parents.
- 9. NOTE: Our COVID policies may change as the situation and rules change.

Jane Jacobs (1916-2006) was a writer, urbanist and activist who championed the voices of everyday people in neighbourhood planning and city-building. "Jane's Walk" was founded in 2007 as a living, walking commemoration of Jane, her legacy and her influence. A "Jane's Walk" is developed and lead by volunteers who want to celebrate the beauty they see in their community. These walks take place around the world on the first weekend in May, as close as possible to her birthdate on May 4th. Jane Jacobs said: "No one can find what will work for our cities by looking at ... suburban garden cities, manipulating scale models, or inventing dream cities. You've got to get out and walk."


This year the Hampton Village Community Association is joining the Meewasin Clean-up Campaign to help make Saskatoon shine.

1. You can report streetlight outages?



Update for Ward 4 residents

<u>Hampton Village Business Park</u> – Kahkewistahaw First Nation has started their land developments and have already begun construction on the new FSIN Main office and gas station / convenience store. They will continue to build more amenities on this land development moving forward. DREAM also submitted a report to Council to approve a car wash in the Hampton Village Business Park.. If approved, it should start this spring. We will be looking to add a grocery store!

<u>Claypool Drive</u> – This winter we had record amounts of snow and continued to see issues with Claypool Drive. I have met with our Public Works Managers on this and they have committed to a solution to this for next winter. We cannot have a major artery of our transportation for this neighbourhood shut down for any period.

<u>Transit Issues</u> – This winter we had several transit runs cancelled during our colder days. City Council has been working with ATU (transit union executives), and our city administration on a plan to ensure this does not happen again next year. Several changes are in the works by Transit administration and City Council expects them to have all buses running daily moving forward.

<u>Snow blowers for Ward 4 Outdoor Rinks</u> – I want to thank Canadian Tire for collaborating with me on a winter recreation strategy for Ward 4 neighbourhoods. Through my communications allowance we were able to purchase 5 new snow blowers for each outdoor rink in Ward 4. I am happy to hear that Hampton Village rink will be operational next winter!

<u>Masks on City buses and in City buildings</u> – As of March 14, 2022, mandatory masks are still required when entering a city building or riding transit. I voted against this when the Provincial Health Order was removed, as I do not believe we have the resources to enforce this and can see this as an escalating problem. However, I lost the vote. This mandate will be reviewed on a monthly basis.

<u>Downtown Entertainment District</u> – I was happy to be selected Co-Chair for the Downtown Entertainment District Advisory Committee. This committee will oversee the New Arena, TCU Place enhancement, and Bus Rapid Transit project for the downtown. The number one issue is finding the funding resources to complete these projects without the use of taxpayer dollars. Several cities across North America have been able to do this. We are using their best practices to devise a plan for Saskatoon. There will be significant public reporting on this as the project moves forward.

School Zone Speed Limit Time Changes — City Council approved the proposed amendments to the Reduced Speed Zones for Schools Policy and a new draft policy for Playground Zones to include year-round speed reduction to 30 km/h daily from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The goal is to have the zones in effect prior to the new school year on September 1, 2022. The recommendation would align the City's school zone policy with national transportation guidelines and implement other best practices for pedestrian safety. The amendments include: 1. New playground speed zones with reduced speed limit of 30 km/h; 2. Year-round lower speed limits in both school and playground zones 7 days a week from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. 3. Adjustments to posted signs and length of current school zones; and 4. Removal of lower speed school zones from high schools, designating them as a "school area" where U-turns are still restricted. More information is available at saskatoon.ca/engage/speed-limit-review. I voted against this as I did not see this as a pressing problem that needed to be solved but lost the vote 6-5.


