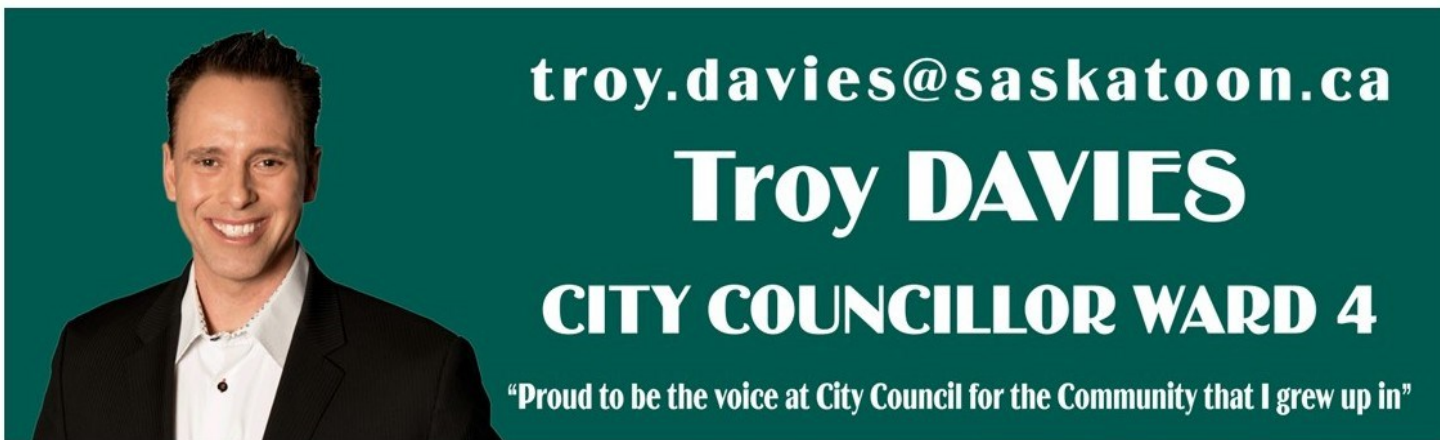

Hampton Village Business Park – Kahkewistahaw First Nation has officially opened the FSIN Main office and a gas station / convenience store. They will continue to build more amenities on this land development moving forward. They announced that they are working on a recreation center with a hockey rink, hotel, McDonalds, grocery store and several other business ventures.



Transit Issues in 2021 –Several changes have been made by Transit administration and City Council after so many cancellations and lack of busses running last winter. A full audit was completed on what occurred and recommendations from the audit have been implemented.

Claypool Drive – Snow fences have now been installed on the airport side of the land to help reduce the amount of snow accumulating on Claypool Drive after a storm. This location has also been identified by the City as a priority 1 plowing location after a major snowfall.



Downtown Entertainment Event District – Land has been purchased through the City Property Realized Reserve Fund for a potential new arena. These funds are from our land bank that is ran through the City to buy land for future neighbourhoods, fire halls etc.... There is zero impact on tax payers to purchase this land, and there has been no decision by Council on whether this will move forward or not in the future. If this does not move forward the Midtown Plaza will be able to purchase the land back at the same price. Cost for this project and funding options will be released in May of 2023.

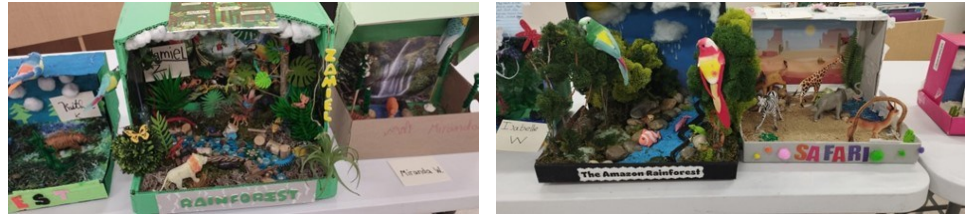

We are almost at the end of term 1! It has been an exciting start here at St Lorenzo Ruiz school. Our St Lorenzo family continues to grow as we welcomed 73 kindergarten students and over 80 new students to our St Lorenzo family this academic year. Our students have been engaged in some exciting projects this term. Our grade 6 students showcased a wax museum, our grade 4's researched and highlighted the achievements of Indigenous leaders in Canada and created dioramas of different habitats.



Our Catholic School Community Council organized our first family engagement evening, a Halloween dance. The turn out was great and we saw very creative costumes!

We are very excited to be one of the forty schools Canada wide, who were selected to be part of the Canadian Schools Playful Network, headed by University of Ottawa researchers to support learning through play to improve engagement and wellbeing of students in middle years. 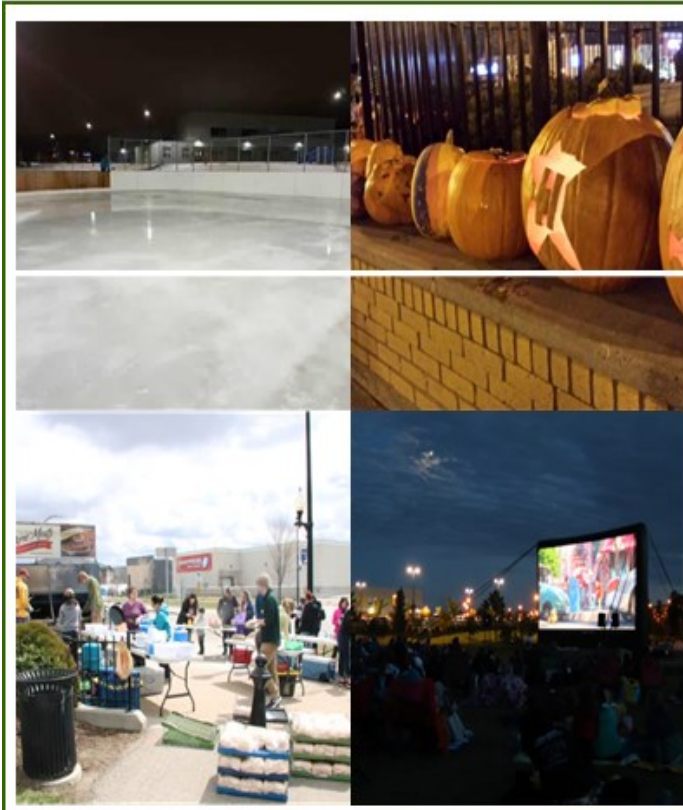

Crime Prevention Tips: Break and Enter and Theft of/from Motor Vehicles



Goals: Reduce Opportunity (Increase Effort/Risk) and Reduce Rewards for Offenders

Have you...

Break and Enter	Theft of/from Motor Vehicles
<p><input type="checkbox"/> Marked your property with a unique identifier (e.g., driver’s license number), documented item serial numbers, other identifying marks/details including make and model, or photographed valuables in case property can be returned and to assist with investigations.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Reported suspicious people or vehicles, noting details (e.g., gender, height, weight, ethnicity, marks/scars/tattoos, behaviours of people; make, model, colour, license plates of vehicles).</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Locked windows/doors, closed window blinds when leaving property unattended (e.g., going to bed, going on vacation, shoveling snow, performing yard maintenance)</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Repaired or secured access points (e.g., locks, garages, doors, windows, and fences/gates).</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Increased occupancy indicators (e.g., installing automatic lights, emptying mailbox, having neighbours or family members check on property while absent, leaving radio or TV on).</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Installed alarm systems or security cameras.</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Not left keys in ignition or hidden in vehicle.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Not left vehicle running while unattended.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Not left valuables in vehicle.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Used the Saskatoon Police Service’s All Valuables Removed dashboard card.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Locked car doors and close car windows.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Installed alarms, surveillance cameras/video.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Improved lighting around your home or park vehicle in well lit areas on the street.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Installed steering wheel security devices.</p>
