GREEN BIN'S ROLLING INTO YOUR NEIGHBOURHOODS

The majority of City Council passed the motions to implement the "Green Cart Program" which is currently underway. I did vote against this mandatory program and also voted against this being billed as a utility to taxpayers - I lost the votes.

Hampton Village should be receiving your green bin during the second week in April. Each bin will come with a kitchen pail attached to the green bin. Inside that pail is important program information and meant to be used for food scraps to transfer to you're green bin. Beginning in May, a monthly average utility fee of \$6.73 will be applied to City utility bills for single-family homes. For updated information go to;

SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM


In two of the last three years Saskatoon has seen record amounts of snow. City Council voted to do a city-wide removal due to the amount of snow received at the end of 2022 and early 2023. Snow crews hauled 102,000 truckloads of snow, enough to fill 21.6 million green carts! The city already had a budget of roughly 14.6 million for snow clearing and removal of snow on some Priority 1 streets, school zones, and to snow blade the city roughly 7 times. The city has taken a loan to cover the 20 million dollars to remove the snow from this winter, and set up a reserve for future years. This is a 0.75 increase to the mill rate, I will be looking at cutting some current services at budget deliberations to cover this multi-year increase. www.saskatoon.ca/moving-around/driving-roadways/winter-road-maintenance




HARRY BAILEY RENOVATION

Harry Bailey Aquatic Centre is now closed for approx 2 years. The building which is now 48 years old will see a major face lift to the exterior of the building, along with upgrades to the pools, weight room, washrooms, multi-purpose rooms, and the building mechanical system. This is an approx. 20 million dollar renovation, 10 million is being paid by the Federal Governments Green and Inclusive Building program, the remaining dollars will come from the City reserve thats set aside for building upgrades.


