CITY ADMINISTRATION PROJECTED BUDGET FOR 2024

In June of this year City Administration released that they have a projected funding shortfall of roughly 50.9 million dollars (17% tax increase) for 2024. City Council immediately scheduled special budget meetings to begin in July, August and September to reduce this projected funding shortfall before budget meetings at the end of November. At the special meeting held on July 25th City Council reduced the shortfall by roughly 23 million dollars over the next 2 years which leaves 29.2 million (9.96 tax increase) that still needs to be addressed for 2024. The next scheduled meeting to continue to reduce the shortfall will take place on August 15th. I will NOT support any major tax hike, I will continue to vote against any new programming, and support a hiring freeze for the next 2 years for the city. I will also support further cuts within city hall if required to reduce the projected funding shortfall in 2024, and 2025.

CONSTRUCTION SITE / DEVELOPMENT ON RICHARDSON ROAD

Construction on this site has stalled and City is aware of the impact the state of site is having on residents in the area. The City is actively working through enforcement processes to have the work completed and the site cleaned up. The enforcement will address stalled construction of foundations, property maintenance including weeds and construction storage on site. Enforcement will take some time to complete, as there are obligations within various Acts to provide an owner/developer with reasonable time to comply with enforcement measures. It is my hope residents will see positive changes in the coming weeks, and by fall the positive impact of enforcement should be realized. Effective immediately the City will provide twice-monthly updates to myself so that I can continue to communicate to residents on this site.



HAMPTON VILLAGE BUSINESS PARK DEVELOPMENT

Residents in Ward 4 should be seeing some further development happening soon in the Hampton Village Business Park (off Claypool Drive) Kahkewistahaw Eagle Landing Development and DREAM are both currently in negotiations with potential partners to bring more commercial amenities to this location. Once these negotiations have been finalized I will ensure they are shared with residents.



- Late registrations will be subject to a \$20.00 late fee after August 25, 2023.

Program Information:

- Season runs from October 22, 2023 to March 17, 2024.
- 14 games on Sundays at Henk Ruys Soccer Centre. Practices are determined by Coach.
- 3 games for *Mini-SISCO Tournament* (U5, U7 & U9) on March 15-17, 2024 at Saskatoon Sports Centre.
- Provided jerseys to be handed in at the end of the season.
- Volunteers are needed to coach Youth Soccer. If not enough volunteers, participation of all parents and/or guardians are required on rotation basis.

- No experience necessary; additional free coaching resources and clinics are available.
