WARD 4 UPDATE

SASKATOON CITY BUDGET FOR 2024 / 2025

VOTED "NO" TO CITY BUDGET

Ward 4 residents made it VERY clear that they were against any major tax increase for 2024 / 2025. The following is some highlights of how I voted;

- Voted NO on the final budget increase Lost the Vote
- Voted NO on 92 budget lines to help reduce the increase Lost 63 Votes
- Voted NO for the new black bin utility Lost the Vote
- Voted NO for the Library tax increases in 2024/25 Lost the Vote
- Voted YES in June, for a mandated tax increase of 4% Lost the Vote
- Made a request to Saskatoon Police Commission and Police Chief to start tracking the data in regards to resources required around shelters. This should NOT be funded by tax dollars. Any additional resources required should be funded by the Province.
- Cost per household (Average assessed value \$344,000) will pay an additional \$10.47 in taxes in 2024.

CONSTRUCTION SITE / DEVELOPMENT ON RICHARDSON ROAD

The City continues to work through enforcement processes to have the work completed and the site cleaned up. The last remaining item to be addressed on the site are the unfinished basement developments. Building Standards is moving through the legal process to enforce compliance on this item. The next update I will be provided by the City will be the first week of January 2024.





NEAULT ROAD (DALMENY RD) CONSTRUCTION

Thanks to some great weather conditions the final paving has been completed for Neault Road. City crews will be installing regulatory signage, speed limits signage, lane designation and limited street lighting at intersections. The expectation is for this to be open at the end of December.
